Ministry Teams

Missions - WiHn is planning to offer childcare at a session in the fall. The Easter offering raised \$4815 and will again be sent to John Dean Town Hospital in Liberia to pay for Nurse Comfort's salary. Thanks to everyone's generosity as we meet a tremendous health-care need.

Food Closet - 250 more bags went out last year from January 1 - June 30, 2023 than during the same time period this year but bags were distributed weekly. This year during the same time period, we have had 39 more new clients.

Christian Education - Our "Message" Small Groups on Wednesdays have started with a 10 a.m. Wednesday morning class in the Artley Room, and an evening Zoom virtual class at 7 p.m. Email pastorgreg.ncd@gmail.com for the Zoom invite. This young adult-adult class will use the outlines from the Message Notes on Sundays. And even during summer, volunteers remain ready to help on Sundays if we have any children attend. If you would like to volunteer, we could use one more. See Terri if you're interested.

Tech - We're continuing to record our full services and post them online. We've made efforts to improve both the video and audio quality throughout the process so there's fewer distractions from the worship music or listening to the message. Church Operations

Finance - The Finance Team thanks everyone for their generosity and discipleship around their giving. With our current financial situation, 1) Our income is down for the year. We are utilizing the rental house income as well as the \$50,000 deposit from UMF funds in June of 2023 for cash flow purposes. 2) Ministry shares (including the Greater Detroit District shares) are being paid monthly for 2024. In 2023, we paid all the ministry shares in September-December. And 3) We are trusting that God is still using us for his will to be done here in Belleville. Please pray and give as you are able and as the Spirit leads. As of May 2024, we have a negative (\$4,587) as our cash available for ongoing ministry. \$124, 494.22 is available in the United Methodist Foundation, and \$55,906 is in designated funds, which now includes the Roof and Elevator Repair fund.

Trustees - The Trustees, Finance, and Ad Council published a "Belleville First UMC Roof and Elevator Project" update about our needs for current roof and elevator repair. All three of these teams have been working hard at trying to find options. We are currently in the "Need for Grants and Generous People" stage before we look at further financing. Current bids are about \$80.000 to fix the roof and \$400,000 to replace the elevator. Currently gifts (over and above giving to the unified general fund) can be given to "Belleville First UMC - Roof and Elevator Fund." (The update, which is in this newsletter, was sent out by email May 15, and placed in the bulletins on May 19 and May 26.)

Staff-Parish Relations Committee - Our Church Conference will be October 17, 2024 at 7 p.m. via Zoom. The SPRC team has started working on the documents. Please keep them, and all our staff, volunteer and paid, in your prayers. We are blessed are to have them.

Nominations and Leadership Development - Our next big volunteer leadership need will be for our Mission's team. Mike and Julie Skelton will be stepping down as our chairpersons even though they wish to continue with the team. We want to thank both as they have served over eight years! Please pray, and let Pastor Greg know if you're interested, or have suggestions.
