Message from the Pastor



One of the first sermons I ever preached was on Romans 12. In fact, it's one of my favorite chapters in the whole of the Bible. I think I like it because Paul tells it to us like it is, without reservation, and tells us that we are all part of the body of Christ having unity in our diversity. Listen to the beginning of chapter 12 from the Message Bible. Perhaps even read it out loud, go ahead, no one's listening...

Place Your Life Before God

12 1-2 So here's what I want you to do, <u>God helping you</u>: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for God. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what God wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you. (MSG)

I highlighted the things that I think help us to accept and to live into change. God helps us to change, especially when we give ourselves over to the change God wants in us. We run the risk of adapting to the culture around us, much like the Israelites did when they were in exile. So we need to be intentional in our daily lives, allowing God to change us from the inside out. When we can do that, we become well-formed fully mature disciples.

Yet, even with these words and knowing that change is just a part of life, don't we still resist and complain when change seems just too hard? I know this is a problem I face. We want an easy button and one never seems to be around.

As we enter a new year, our hopes are high. We hope that coronavirus will be defeated. We hope for a smooth transition to a new president. We hope for an anti-racist world that begins in our own hearts. We hope for life to return to normal. Yet, what is normal? Maybe that's just it. Maybe the way we embrace what God does for us is by accepting that normal is a fantasy created by our culture. Maybe that change from the inside out isn't just one and done, but a constant renewing and remodeling and reshaping.

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. (NRSV)

So let us embrace change in the new year. Let us be new creations in Christ in the new year.

¹⁷ So if anyone is in Christ, **there is a new creation**: everything old has passed away; **see, everything has become new!** ¹⁸ <u>All this is from God</u>, who reconciled us to God's self through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; ¹⁹ that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to God's self, not counting their trespasses against them, and **entrusting the message of reconciliation to us.** ²⁰ So we are ambassadors for Christ, since **God is making God's appeal through us**; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.

Won't you join me in the new year's resolution to embrace change, especially the change that God want for us? Remember, it's not us who makes this happen, but God in Christ and through the power of the Holy Spirit that brings this change within us. 
Scripture: Mark 11: 15-19

I hope and pray with you that the New Year brings a time for peace and love to prevail as we move along from isolation and disconnection in this pandemic journey!!! One way that the new year at Belleville First will offer a chance for continually renewed connectedness, is through the next semester of Growth Groups (previously referred to as small groups or Sunday School) coming up for the Lenten season and kicking off the week of February 17th. This is a great way to actively live out the **BFUMC vision part of being God's extended family that is truly Christ centered**. Meet up with some old friends, make some new friends, and after you have navigated the spiritual pathway Pastor Mary has provided us collectively by *Encountering God in Worship*, participating in a Growth Group will take you along the next step of *Engaging God in scripture and growing in trust*.

Growth Group training for Leaders and Coordinators (if you'd like to know more or volunteer for this just let me know) will take place the week of January 27th, when sign-ups will actively begin. In the meantime, know that options for meeting are so far scheduled to continue as follows:

Sunday mornings for the children at 10 a.m. with Marlayna Keelan, Jenn Daigneau, Megan Skelton, and myself starting February 21st. We will be studying 24 Hours That Changed the World by Adam Hamilton. It is my understanding that the church as a whole has done this study in the not too distant past, though the children have not yet, as they were likely too young at that time. This will give them a chance to experience it too, remind their grown ups of the best parts, and have coordinated curriculum, activities, and media to engage with.

Food Closet



On November 16th, Mark Groeneweg made his second delivery this fall to Belleville High School for the schools in house food pantry. Four special education students helped unload and set up the foods delivered. \$500 in food was donated to their pantry at this time. We will continue to help supply food for their food pantry needs.

Food Closet



Due to the overwhelming generosity of our community, our Emergency Food Closet monetary donations have increased dramatically. Starting January 5th, 2021 we will be giving out bags of food on a **weekly** basis instead of every other week for as long as we financially can. Our Chase Food Closet account currently has \$43,000. \$9,000 of this came from 2 local residents this fall. Other money was received from memorial contributions, businesses, churches, and church members who contribute on a regular basis. We still have \$11,000 in Food Only Simply Give cards from the fundraiser held in the fall of 2019. I do not see Meijer selecting us for another fundraising campaign until most of this money is spent. Meijer additionally gave us \$5,000 last March which was used for \$20 Food Only cards which were given out during April thru July when we gave out half bags of food and a \$20 Food Only card. This past July Meijer donated another \$2,500 which was spent on groceries. Since March 17th, we have had 80 new clients.
