I hope you enjoyed our time in March when Pastor Mary opened her sacred home space in the parsonage through virtual worship and shared some of her spiritual practices through several sermons, including her journaling and Bibles. The children's Sunday School Growth Group that meets on Sunday mornings received a journal in their Lenten bags and used it to record prayer requests and other things during our time together over the last month. If you are looking for a spiritual practice to go to, now that Lent is behind us, read from the Gospel of Mark each day, and check out the book, *Soul Shift: The Measure of a Life Transformed*, by Steve DeNeff and David Drury. Journaling as you go through this practice, and setting aside intentional time each day to pray while spending time in silence and solitude as you pray, are a few more steps on the Belleville First Spiritual Pathway. Another will be based on expressing faith through influence, as you engage in articulating your faith story and sharing it with others. There will be a group led by Pastor Mary that is open to the tough questions... whatever questions folks may have... NO HOLDS BARRED!!! Is there something you've always grappled with faith-wise that you really want to sort through??? Areas of the Bible that just don't make "sense" to you??? Come and have some Pizza with the Pastor, and sort these things out. If an answer is not available on demand, it will be researched and revisited!!! A few more topics may be offered as well, and by the time we are again on a church wide study this fall, we will all had the opportunity to walk each and every step of the BFUMC Spiritual Pathway . Lastly, if you are looking for ways to express your faith through service, there are many possibilities coming up!!! ## For the healing of the Nations:

### A pastoral letter on violence against Asian-Americans

Dear Friends in Christ in The Michigan Conference,

Earlier this week, the soul of our country was deeply wounded again as a twenty-one-year-old young man shot and killed eight people, six of them Asian-American women, in a killing spree at massage parlors in Georgia. This heinous act of violence is only the latest in a series of verbal and physical attacks against Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) individuals, which have accelerated since the beginning of the coronavirus pandemic. I am aware that the past year has seen an increase in violence of many kinds. Murder rates and other violent crimes have increased in several major cities in recent months. All such violence is to be decried, even as we seek solutions for it.

The violence that targets specific groups of people, violence rooted in racism or misogyny, is particularly pernicious and must be called out. Some may question the role anti-Asian racism played in this recent violence. The shooter was obviously a troubled person who had been a customer at some of the establishments he later terrorized. His motives may have been tangled, but among the tangle was murderous intent directed at Asian-American women. Whatever his reasons, his actions have deepened the fear and anxiety among Asian-Americans in this country, fear and anxiety fed by hatred and violence directed toward them since the beginning of the COVID crisis. While the coronavirus may have emerged in China's human community, to take our frustrations out on Asian-Americans, to blame them and direct hatred and violence toward them is intellectually dishonest and morally obtuse.

At the heart of our Christian faith is a belief that all persons are created in the image of God, that no matter the hue of our skin, the particular facial features we display, the weave of our hair, the place of our birth, the ancestry of our families, we carry within us the image of God. To fail to see the image of God is to fail to live our faith. The love of God we know in Jesus Christ is a love for all people, for all the nations. The Bible begins with the creation of humankind in the image of God and ends with a vision of the heavenly city through which the river of the water of life flows. On either side of the river is the tree of life, the leaves of which are for "the healing of the nations" (Revelation 22:2). The healing of the nations, healing offered to all people. God extends God's love to all the nations and calls us to do the same.

We have been reminded too often in recent months of our failures to see the image of God in all and to love with the expansive love of God. Such failure is sin, and we are to struggle against sin wherever it is found, whether in our hearts, in our policies, in our cultural artifacts, or in our systems. Let us offer prayers for our Asian-American family members, members of our human family. Let us listen to their stories. Let us join together with all God's people and pray the words of the hymn rooted in Revelation 22:2: "For the healing of the nations, Lord, we pray with one accord; for a just and equal sharing of the things that earth affords; to a life of love in action help us rise and pledge our word, help us rise and pledge our word."

## ***Weekly Bag Numbers***

Since January 1, 2021 all food closet recipients are able to receive food on a weekly basis. In January, 105 were distributed and 11 new clients were registered. In February, 67 bags were distributed and 1 new client was added. The lower numbers were likely due to the cold weather and snow.

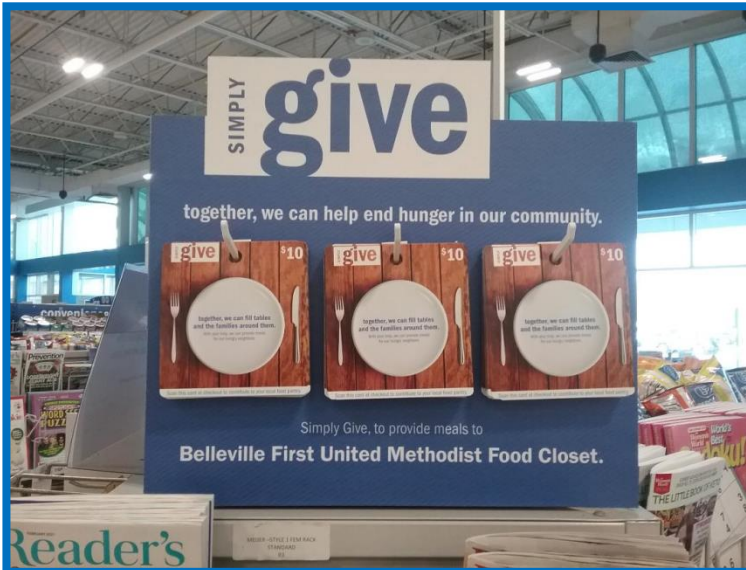
## ***Easter Blessings***

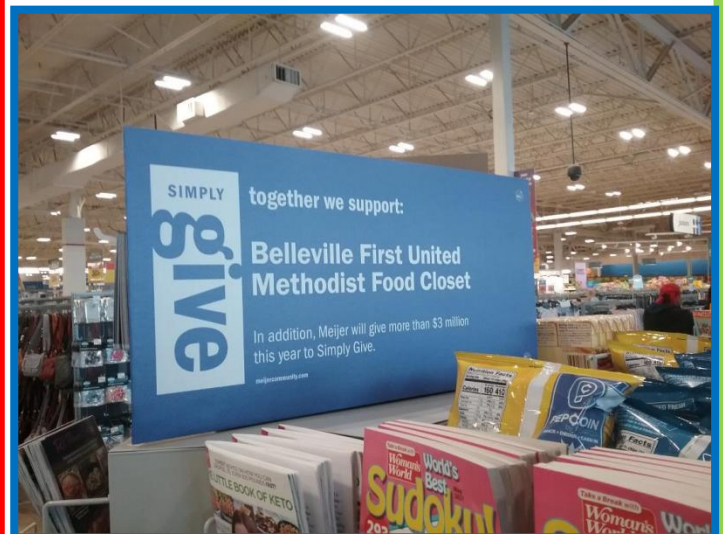

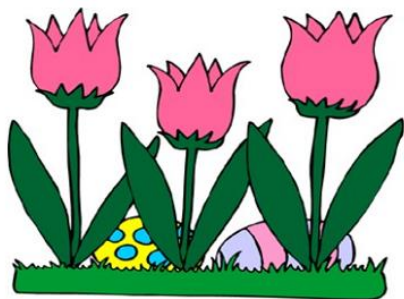
